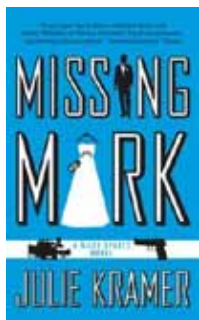
**The Girl in the Gatehouse**

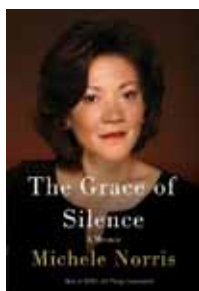
**One Thousand Gifts: A Dare to Live Fully Right Where You Are**

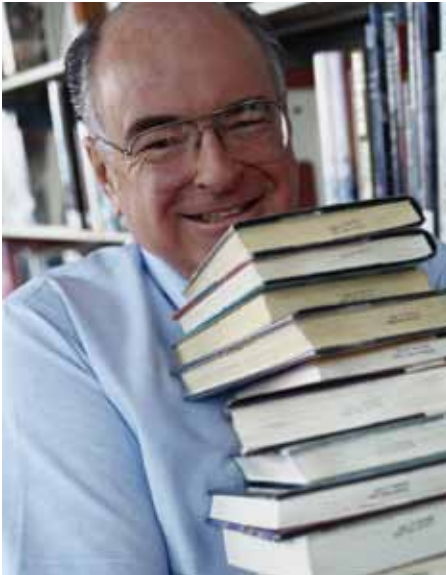

Age Well Live Smart

It turns out that playing video games may be good for your brain health. The book "The Secret Life of the Grown-Up Brain: The Surprising Talents of the Middle-Aged Mind" by Barbara Strauch reports a study being conducted by Columbia University indicating there is some evidence that video games can cause your brain to shift focus and multi-task within the context of the whole game, which may improve how your brain operates.



At Home Services staff first met Padma when she requested a volunteer to bring her books. A disability made it difficult for her

to get to a library. Her constant love and instinctive need to learn and share herself through her books, art, photography and dance is strong. She says, "Life has walked me through different arts in so many different ways." About the library's volunteer service she remarks, "Nancy became my friend" and "Winni is a dear. I cannot tell you how wonderful you all have been and how much this service means to me."

Born in Chennai, South India, she came to America after winning a graduate scholarship to the University of Michigan. Her work was published in "The New Yorker" magazine and elsewhere. She taught at universities and conducted writing seminars at Vassar, Columbia and other colleges. She lived briefly in Europe and recently spent seven years in Hawaii.

Her parents always encouraged her artistic abilities and she sees them "as the greatest blessings in my life." Padma exhibited and talked about her work at Nokomis Library last September. Collection policy changes

In the current fiscal environment, all Hennepin County departments are required to make budget reductions. The Library will face a \$2 million reduction in 2012, which will result in a change in limits to the number of items checked out on an individual card and the number of items on reserve. This is part of the strategy to make an increasingly limited number of materials available to more Hennepin County residents and library users.

However, these limits will not affect those in the At Home or Deposit Collection programs. The number of items on reserve, checked out, and the length of time materials may be checked out will stay the same for these Outreach Services patrons.
