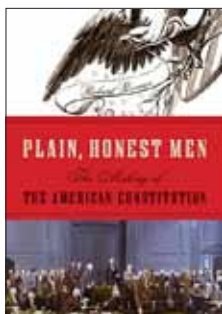

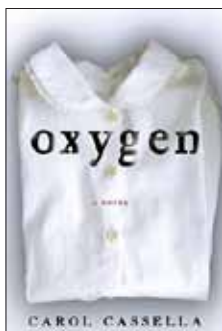


Plain, Honest Men: The Making of the American Constitution

Do you have trouble using the telephone?

Minnesota residents may be eligible to receive a **no cost** telephone through the Minnesota Telephone Equipment Distribution (TED) Program. Speakerphones, amplified (cordless or corded) telephones, captioned telephones, phones to amplify soft voices, telephone ring signalers, and more are provided to those who have difficulty using a regular telephone due to a hearing loss, speech, or physical disability.

The program is provided by the Minnesota Department of Human Services, TED Program and administered by the Department of Commerce - Telecommunications Access Minnesota (TAM) and funded by a telephone

surcharge. Income eligibility guidelines do apply. Please visit their website for more information at www.tedprogram.org, e-mail ted.program@state.mn.us or call 1.800.657.3663.

They are newly distributing wireless Jitterbug J, Sprint BlackBerry and Katana cell phones through a wireless pilot program until the end of March 2010. Please contact Sharie Hawkins at sharie.hawkins@state.mn.us if you are interested. The TED Program provides the wireless device itself at no charge and is not responsible for the monthly wireless service fees.

Meet Renee H., Public Service Assistant for the Adult Corrections Facility

Renee H.'s love of reading brought her to the Outreach Department eight years ago, and she continues to share this love of reading with the residents at Hennepin County's Adult Corrections Facility (ACF). Each week, Renee processes book and magazine requests from the residents, checks in returned items and packs close to 50 boxes of materials to bring to ACF. Renee recalls how eight years ago, "we were taking about 400 requests a week, and now we are at close to 1,000 a week." She enjoys the variety of her work and relishes the fact that her job is never boring.

Renee also finds interesting the wide range of reading interests and levels among the residents at ACF. "We could have one resident ask for 'War and Peace,' and someone else reading The 'Wizard of Oz.'" Residents also request reference information on careers and many other subjects. Renee loves seeing "residents really show an increase in their reading interests" and describes how some "run down the hall into the library, wanting to see what request is available" that week.

When she picks up a book, Renee typically chooses popular fiction, thrillers, or suspense novels. She also loves to cook and is kept busy by her 14-year-old son Darius.
