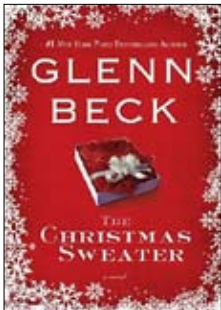

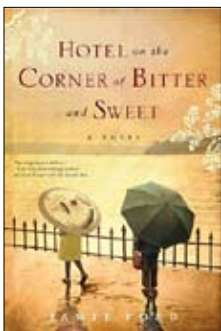
### **The Christmas Sweater**

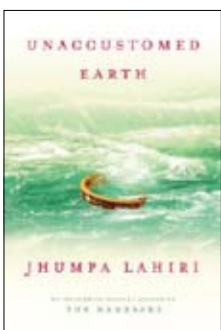
### **Hotel on the Corner of Bitter and Sweet**

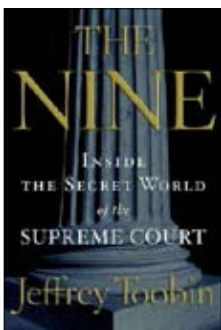
### **Unaccustomed Earth: Stories**

## Two library catalogs will become one

Beginning Aug. 27, Hennepin County Library's two catalogs will be consolidated into one catalog containing more than 5 million books, CDs, DVDs and other items. The combined catalog will have more than 1.6 million unique titles. Combining the two catalogs will give library customers access to the nation's 12th largest public library collection. This consolidation will help reduce overall operating costs and increase efficiencies.

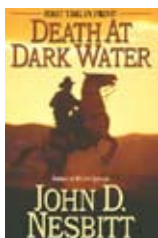

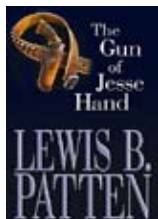

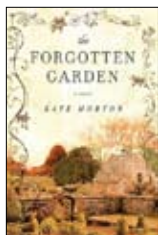
