Golden Valley Library supervisor Chantra Hok provided a staff welcome and shared information about Golden Valley's service demographics, programming, book clubs, and partnerships.

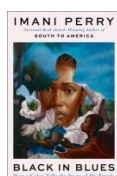
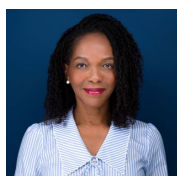
